CONCEPT, CONTENT, AND TYPES OF COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY PRECONDITIONS

The Commercial Code of Ukraine determines commercial activity as the activity of business entities in the sphere of production aimed at manufacturing and sale of products, performance of different working tasks or giving services according to the price-list: "the activity of business entities in the sphere of social production, aimed
